



This is the last Will and Testament of me

Davyman I hereby revoke all former Wills and Testamentary dispositions
heretofore made by me and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

I appoint my Brothers Stephen Bowley of Russell Square Brighton aforesaid Davyman
William Bowley of Ovingdean in the said County of Sussex Farmer and my
friend George Henry Barnes of Upper Rock Gardens Brighton aforesaid Merchant
(hereinafter called "my Trustees") to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will

I bequeath all my plate linen china glass books pictures prints wines liquors furniture
and other household effects to my dear wife Ruth Bowley for her absolute use and
benefit I give devise and bequeath all my real and personal estate not hereby otherwise
disposed of unto my Trustees Upon trust that my Trustees shall sell call in and
convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not consist of money
and shall with and out of the moneys produced by such sale calling in and
conversion and with and out of the moneys produced by such sale calling in
and conversion and with and out of my ready money pay my funeral and
testamentary expenses and debts And shall stand possessed of the residuary trust
moneys upon the trusts following (that is to say) As to two equal eighth parts thereof
In trust for my wife the said Ruth Bowley for her absolute use and benefit And as
to the remaining sixth eighth parts thereof In trust for my six children Sophia
Blanche ^{Cousin} Charles James Bowley Edwin Brook Bowley Frank Bowley Percy Leon Bowley
and Ernest William Gerton equally share and share alike as and when they shall
respectively attain the age of Twenty one years And with respect to the expectant share
of my infant children I direct my Trustees to invest the same in any investments
authorised by law for trust funds with power to vary the investments thereof from
time to time at their discretion provided always and I declare that my Trustees shall
during the minority of any infant child of mine pay the income of such infant
to the guardian for the time being appointed by this my Will but so long only as
such guardian shall in the discretion of my Trustees continue to properly support
and maintain such infant provided always that in the event of any child of
mine dying without having attained a vested interest in my residuary estate
then I declare that such child's share shall be paid to and divided equally
amongst my surviving children And I declare that if the share of my son
Charles James Bowley who is now residing in Australia shall not be claimed by
him within the period of five years from my decease then I direct my Trustees
to pay and divide the share of my said son in my residuary estate unto and



equally between) and amongst such of my children as may be living at
the expiration of such five years as and when they shall respectively attain the
age of Twenty one years And lastly I appoint my said wife during her life and
after her decease my Daughter the said Sophia Blanche Bowley Guardian of
my Infant children In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this
third day of October One thousand eight hundred and ninety
